So far Eleanor is recovering and doing extremely well. Eleanor and her parents are going back to Mauritius mid August. (5) As has been the case over the last few years we made a substantial donation to the Kind Cuts For Kids Foundation to help them with the good work they undertake abroad.

We considered two other cases, the first one did not meet our guidelines and the second one has been referred to specialists in Mauritius for further investigation.

Liza Sebastien



Liza was born with cerebral palsy that affected the muscles in her legs and a crooked foot. The parents spent a large sum money to have corrective surgery performed at Apollo Bramwell hospital in Mauritius. the surgery was not successful. They

approached the Mauritian Government for financial help to send Liza overseas for surgery, but were unsuccessful as the Mauritian Government took the view that Liza's condition could be treated in Mauritius. They contacted hospitals in the USA and Australia and they received a positive response from the Royal children hospital in Melbourne.

They organised public fundraising and went on television and contacted radio stations to make a case for Liza. When SACIM Australia offered to help it was a great relief for the parents. Liza came two years ago for surgery and since then she has made great progress to the point where with some help she can stand up.

She recently returned to the RCH for follow up and further surgery. The treating specialist took the view that further surgery was not warranted as Liza will go through a lot of pain and suffering for little or no progress. The specialist was very pleased and amazed by her progress and she is now on a strict exercise regime and her progress is closely monitored by a physiotherapist in Mauritius.

Before going back to Mauritius the parents were invited to attend our committee meeting. They were very grateful for what SACIM has done and they presented the committee with a painting. They wanted us to convey their gratitude to all members and supporters of SACIM.

A case for the Mauritian authorities

I have been a committee member of SACIM (Australia) for over 25 years. During this time I have often been told that Mauritius is progressing rapidly and very soon will not need our help in that field.

The visit of Josian Sebastian from Mauritius, a father who accompanied his daughter of 10 years old to look for medical treatment in Australia, told me that many facilities for children suffering from certain diseases are not available in Mauritius, and that is the reason he is in Australia.

His daughter was diagnosed with 'Cerebral Palsy' at birth and later on could not walk.

During 10 years he has looked for help in the medical profession in Mauritius with no success. He, eventually enquired for medical help abroad. Finally he met with one of my relatives in Mauritius, who told him that Australia was well advanced in this field. With the help of his uncle in Australia, he made arrangements with the Royal Children Hospital, in Melbourne, to see a specialist in this field.

Two years ago he came to Australia with an appointment to meet Dr Paulo Selber, an orthopedic surgeon , at the Royal Children Hospital, in Melbourne. The surgeon advised surgery for Liza, the daughter of Josian. Since Josian didn't have the financial means to go ahead with the treatment, he approached the SACIM Organisation in Australia. SACIM (Australia) agreed to pay for the treatment, and the operation was a success.

This year, Liza and her parents are back in Australia after two years, for further treatments, and this time again with the help of SACIM (Australia). More work was done by Dr Paulo Selber to improve the lifestyle of Liza.

This case is proof that Mauritius still, does not have all the facilities and the expertise in certain field of diseases, and need the help of specialists from abroad. Unfortunately, it is not easy to make contact with parents and children of Mautitius, and especially of Rodrigues, who are in great need of help for medical facilities, not available in Mauritius.

I suggest that the High Commissioner of Mauritius and the Consul in Australia, should be able to let the Government of Mauritius and the people, aware that these facilities are available in Australia, and that they should take advantage of these.

On the same day we brought Eleanor to the Apollo Hospital for a general check up. After an echography she was diagnosed with a left "Pulmonary Artery Stenosis".

A CT Angio Pulmonary confirmed the diagnostic on the 23rd February and the doctor advised us that a "Left Pulmonary Angioplasty" was mandatory. Such a procedure was best done in a pediatric cardiac institute, which is not available in Mauritius. From that day onward, nothing had been the same. Our child has been afraid to play as she used to and she had to give up some of her after school activities.

We started to look around for a Pediatric cardiac institute where the procedure could be done. After a conversation with our cousin Chantal Jodun we opted Krystel & Patrick for Australia. In memory of Norbert Toussaint,29 October 1952 - 3 July 2015.



In the late 50s when Norbert Toussaint was exchanging looks with Margaret Oxenham across the benches of the Visitation Primary School at Vacoas, little did he know that his Australian adventure had already started. Norbert and Margaret had common origins from Vacoas in Mauritius, and later on built a whole life-time of dreams and achievements together in faraway Australia. Margaret's family migrated to Melbourne in 1967, and that was the start of their Australian adventure together.

They did not physically keep in touch after that, but the bond between them must have been strong, as when Margaret visited Mauritius in 1976 after completing secondary school and working for a few years in Melbourne she linked up with Norbert again to consolidate another chapter of their Australian adventure still to come. The first chapter of that Australian adventure started when Norbert migrated to Australia to join Margaret in 1979. That Australian adventure will include a long relationship with SACIM.

In 1980 Margaret's sister Rosemay was already involved with SACIM Victoria, formed only 7 years before. Rosemay must have been an effective motivator for the whole family as both Norbert and his sister Yolène joined the SACIM committee as ordinary members to later move on to the executive committee for many years. IN 1986 Rosemay became President of SACIM Vic and served in that office until 1991 when Norbert assumed the Treasurer's role. In the same year Yolène was elected as Secretary, and served in that office for nine years.

Norbert acted as our Treasurer for nine years and many committee members who worked with him during that period told me that he was a hard and extremely effective worker who lifted SACIM from a small family charity group it was then to the professional organization it is today. In that time Norbert served under three Presidents (Rosemay Oxenham, Fritz Herry and Jocelyn Rosette), and in those nine years, twelve SACIM children from Mauritius came to Melbourne for life-saving surgery at the Royal Children's Hospital, with two of them returning three times for on-going treatment, and one returning twice. Anyone who has worked on the SACIM committee will confirm that that was quite an achievement – in coordination, fundraising, medical liaisons, hospital visits, foster-parenting and all the responsibilities associated with doing volunteer charity work at that level. In parallel with managing the SACIM accounts for a long time Norbert and Margaret have supported the children by numerous hospital visits and providing respite to foster parents for two of the twelve cases over the years.

In addition to the devotion to the SACIM work, over the years Norbert also had the passion for volunteer work elsewhere. Those included managing the finances of his local Keysborough Resurrection Parish for a few years, being on the board the St. James College at Bentleigh East where his two boys Mark and Olivier went to secondary school, treasurer of the Edithvale Life-Saving Club where the boys were training for years, and also helping several sporting organizations in which he played soccer at competition level. All this was achieved in parallel with his normal and everyday career as a professional accountant, and successfully bring up his own family. There is an old saying stating that if you need something done well and on time, then find someone who is busy to help you. Norbert has always successfully delivered the tasks that he undertook with all the volunteer organizations that he supported, thereby demonstrating to all of us that the saying is actually correct. If you are busy it means that you know what you are doing, and will be sought after by those who need results.

Norbert left us in July 2015, aged 62. He was a quiet high achiever. On the day of his funeral at the Resurrection Parish church, it was standing room only family, friends, work colleagues and representation from all the organizations for which he contributed so much time as a volunteer over the years during his Australian adventure. The congregation included many current SACIM committee members, and five ex-presidents. That was confirmation that his good work lives on, and will be remembered for a very long time. His Australian adventure will have a beneficial influence in several spheres for years to come.
